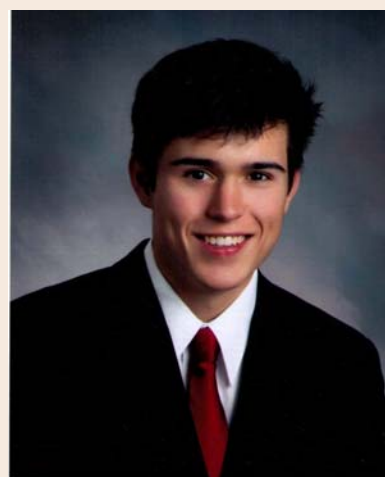

**ABOUT THE PROGRAMS:** The purpose of the B.R. Chamberlain Foundation Outstanding SBACS Scholars Contest and the John R. Chandler Outstanding Musicians Contest is to discover and recognize students in our Southern Baptist Christian schools across the nation with exemplary expertise and accomplishments in scholastics or music, Christian character and service to others. The extraordinary level of achievement, character and leadership evidenced by this year's participants demonstrates that our schools are producing outstanding results, young men and women of excellence who will be the salt and light that the Lord Jesus Christ expects and requires to lead His Kingdom.

**The B.R. Chamberlain Foundation Outstanding SBACS Scholars Contest** selects two national winners of \$1,000 each and four regional winners of \$500 each. Winners may direct their scholarship money to the college or university of their choice. To compete for the award, seniors must meet the following criteria:

- minimum combined SAT score of a 1250 (math and verbal) or 28 on the ACT.
- minimum non-weighted GPA of a 3.5 on a 4.0 scale.
- testimony of their faculty to their good character, service and leadership within their school, church and community.

**The John R. Chandler Outstanding SBACS Musicians Contest** selects one national winner of \$1,000 and two regional winners of \$500 each. The winners may direct their scholarship money to the college or university of their choice. To compete for the award, seniors must:

- maintain a non-weighted GPA of a 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.
- be highly involved in music and show a superior level of vocal or instrumental skill.
- demonstrate an active faith in Christ.
- audition by CD.
- receive recommendations from their music directors and teachers indicating their good character, service and leadership within their school, church and community.
